We saw a play with Ms. Electricity.

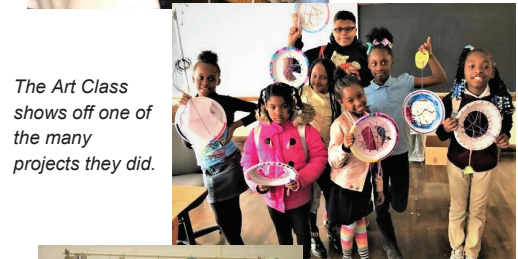

The 3rd Grade learned about the heart by inspecting a pig's heart with Dr. LaCesha Brentley.



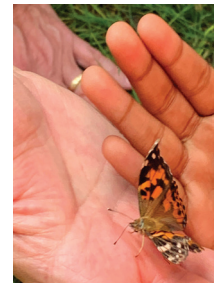
The Art Class shows off one of the many projects they did.
